One of our young members, Helena John (age 9), is a national winner in her age group, of the British Dyslexia Association Art Exhibition 2010. She had chosen to support the British Dyslexia Association this year and the exhibition was held during Dyslexia Awareness Week Nov 1 to 7, the theme was Hidden Dyslexia.

Helena's painting entitled Autumn Walk is on display at the 'Picture This!' exhibition in the Shell Building in Central London. Helena and her family excitedly travelled to London on Tuesday November 2 to receive her award. Helena said "It was incredible to see my painting on display along with art done by some other children and grown-ups too." and "There was a big award ceremony and I was presented with a gold medal and a certificate. I was really surprised and excited to win Primary Gold. I have always wanted to have a painting in an exhibition as I really love doing all kinds of art and it was great just to be in the exhibition in London, never mind about being the Gold Winner. All the people there were very kind indeed to all the children and they said lots of nice things about my painting. There were some professional artists and some other important people there too"

Helena had to write 50 words to accompany the entry: A walk I did with my family this October at Gibside inspired my painting. I remembered the beautiful building we walked towards through the lovely avenue of big, old trees. Families were running around playing Tig. I used pen on watercolour like when Quentin Blake illustrates the Roald Dahl stories.

Jean John, Helena's mother said, "We can't say often enough what an incredible boost to her confidence having this recognition for her artwork has been. She received such wonderful encouragement from BDA staff, members, etc., on the night that she feels more able to overcome and accomplish, no matter what. Best of all, it has made a difference to the way she is viewed by those around her. Margaret Malpas (Chair BDA) was also present & we liked the fact that the Weeks' theme was Hidden Dyslexia"

Jonty Hearnden from BBC's "Cash in the Attic" signed the back of Helena's painting, and she talked to Lord Addington, Dominic Hubbard (Vice President of the BDA). Helena and her family enjoyed the view from the Shell Building of the London Eye and across the Thames
