Touchpad technologies

This year has seen a rapid development in iPads, iPhones and other touchpad laptops, which look as if they will be very useful for our dyslexic users. There are new apps (mini focussed programs) coming out each day. Some of these are just fun items, but there are others to help with reading and spelling. The BDA New Technologies Committee website www.bdatech.org is trying to keep up with developments, so do take a look. Another exciting development is that of the e-book – the iPad has colour and will speak out the text, not necessarily highlighting it as it moves, but the device is not as robust as it might be. The Kindle is a much cheaper and more robust solution, but only has a cream background with slate text that has some variations in font and size. Some books will talk, but not all. There is a vast range of titles available from Amazon, mostly much cheaper than a paper book and by linking the Kindle to a computer, you can download thousands of free titles from http://www.gutenberg.org/wiki/Main_Page
